- The first Earth Day was held in 1970.

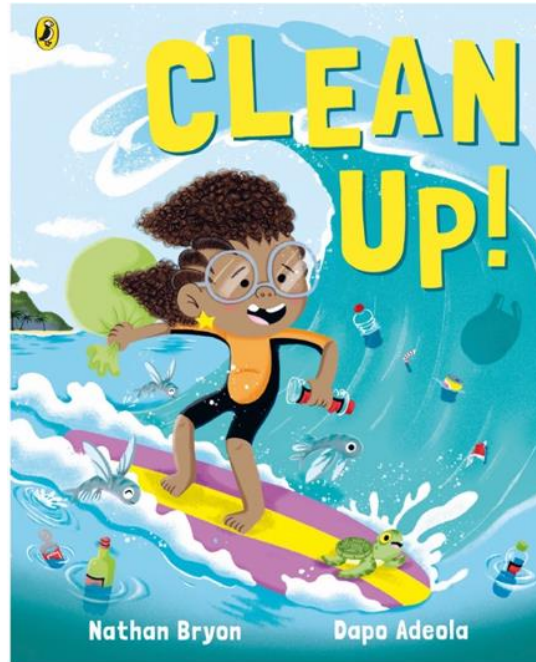

# Reception

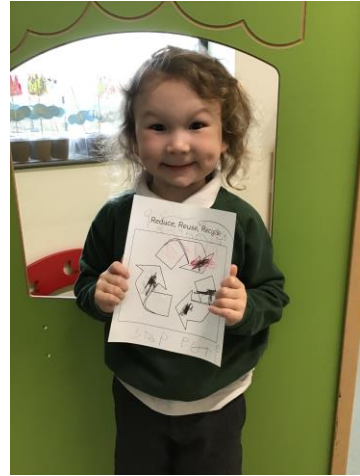
Hazel class read the story 'Clean Up!' and discussed the problem of littering and what happens when it gets into the ocean.



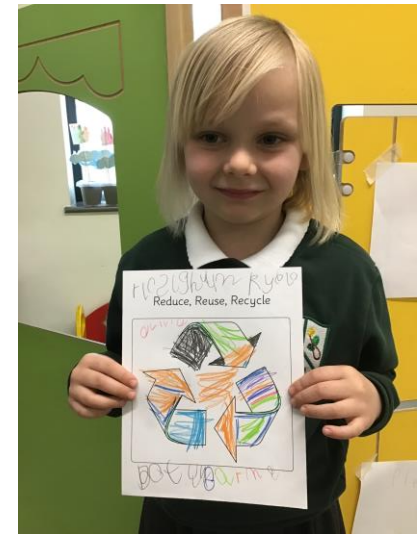
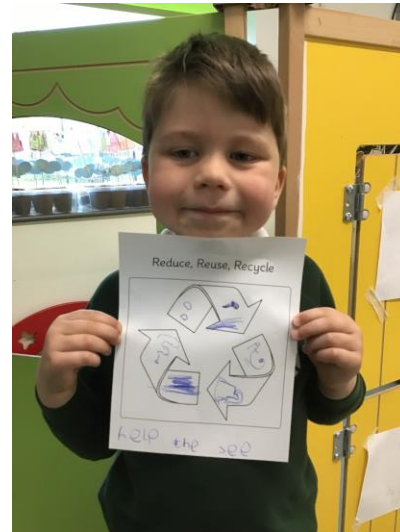
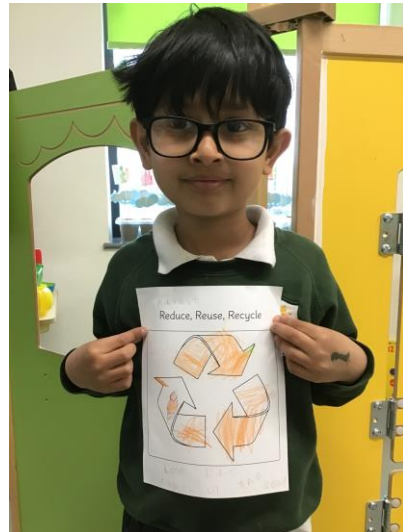
Did you know that when you throw plastic bags in the ocean, sea turtles get tangled up in them and can't swim properly. They also think that they are jelly fish and try to eat them!

We also made posters to tell everyone to Reduce, Reuse and Recycle!

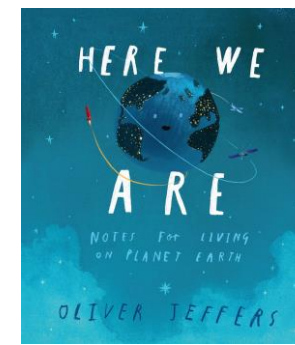

**H**elp save Earth.

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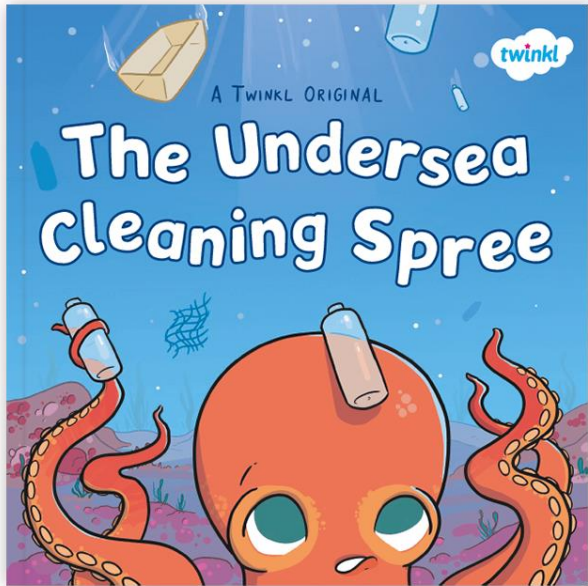
We then worked as a whole class to write an acrostic poem about what we can do to help make Earth a better place for us to live, and people in the future to live.

We discussed how we can recycle and reuse plastic for other purposes, such as creating artwork.



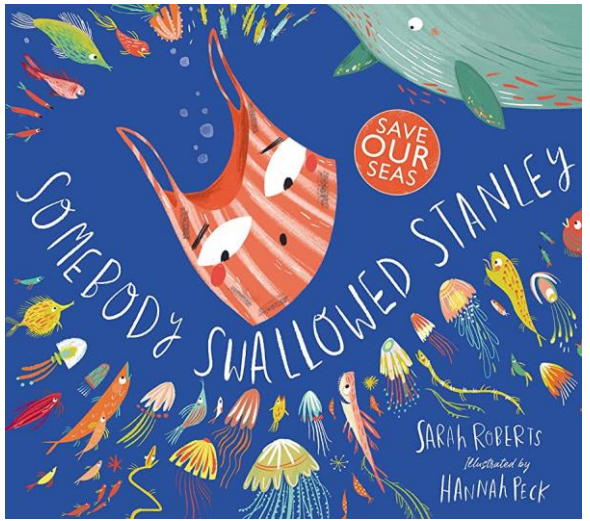
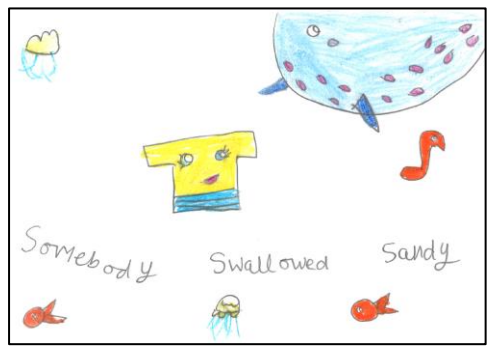
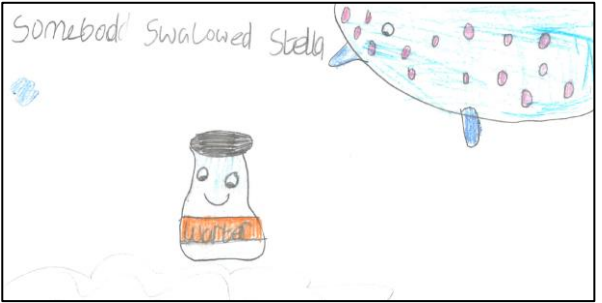
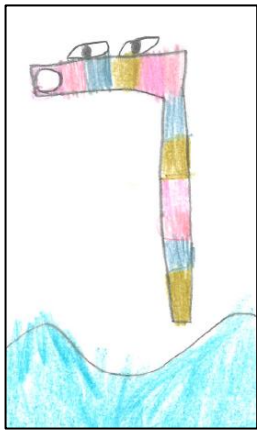

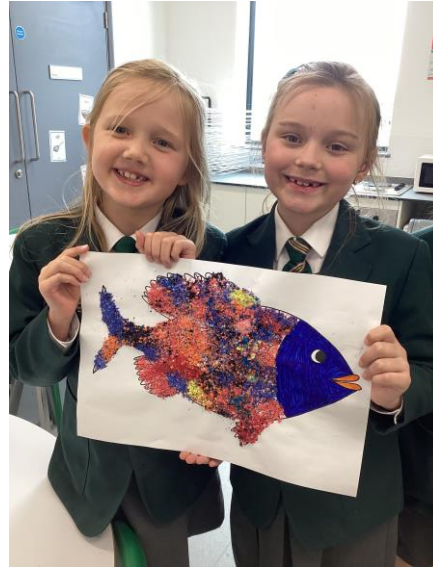
## Year 2

**Did you know?**  
Normal glitter is made of plastic and can never degrade. The glitter can get stuck in fish's gills and make small holes which can seriously harm them!
