"We all have different skin colours."

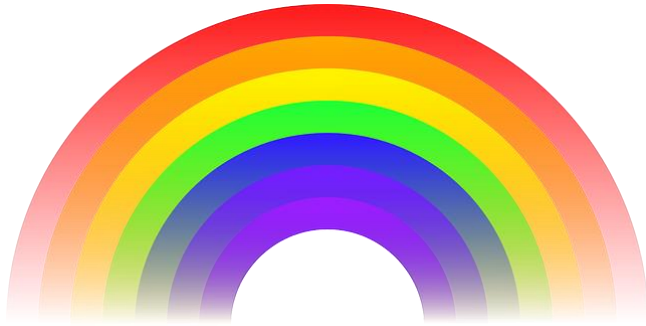
"Some of us are tall and some are short."

I like football and my friend likes skipping.

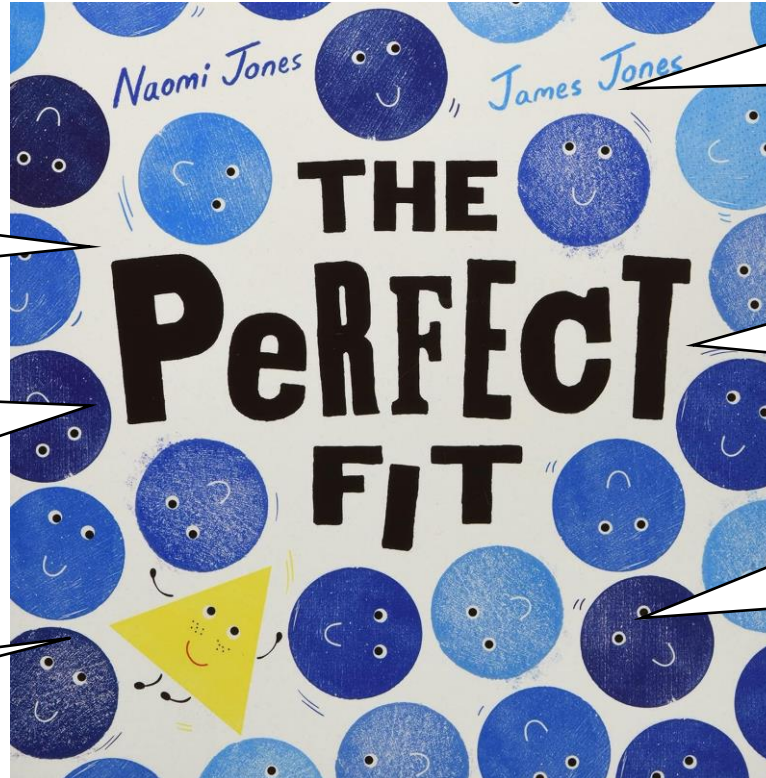
Some children in our class wear glasses and some don't.
